



## THE REPUBLIC BANK CARIBBEAN JUNIOR OPEN GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS 2017

The second day of the 8<sup>th</sup> Republic Bank Caribbean Junior Open took place in beautiful conditions today at St Andrews Golf Course. Twenty foreign juniors are competing this year, in all there are 101 juniors competing in the various categories.

In the boy's 16-17 age group, Jonathan Jean-Noel from Guadeloupe increased his lead adding another 76, to stand on 152. Trinidad & Tobago's Sam Avey is still in second but is now 5 shots behind with 2 day score of 157(78,79). Barbadian Iz Hustler has moved up to 3<sup>rd</sup> with 163(84, 79).

In the 16-17 girls defending champion Serena Mackenzie increased her lead to 16 strokes after day two shooting an 83,80. Sarah Ramphal shot the best score in the division today shooting an 80 which followed her disappointing 99 on day 1..

In the boys 14 to 15 age group pre-tournament favorite Barbadian Xavier Wiggins shot his second 77 for a two day total of 154. Xzavier leads his fellow Barbadian Oziah Layne by 4 strokes (158).

The girl's 14-15 age Yeji Lee improved by 10 strokes to take the lead with scores of 79 today and 89 yesterday. Zoe Correia moved into second place with a total score of 173, Samantha Juteram is now in third place on 175.

Chris Richards Jnr leads the 13 & under age group with scores of 78,84, Zico Correia made up a lot of ground today and is now second with 79 today to go with his yesterday score of 85, to only trail by 2 strokes. Jamaica's Tristan Brown is a further 4 strokes behind after shooting an 81 today.

The girls 13 and under Barbadian Emily Odwin shot a score of 81 today for a 171 total. She leads from fellow Barbadian Eryn Blakely whose total is 181. Augustina Rebolledo from the Turks & Caicos is still in third place with a score of 189.
