The first day of the 11th Republic Bank Caribbean Junior Open took place in beautiful conditions today at St Andrews Golf Course. Twenty nine foreign juniors are competing this year, in all there are 93 juniors competing in the various categories.

In the boy's 18 & under age group, the leader is Jonathan Jean-Noel from Guadeloupe who shot a fine 75. Barbadian Iz Hustler following in 2nd place with 78 with fellow countrymen Ozaih Layne and Zxavier Wiggins in third with both shooting 80.

In the 18 & under girls defending champion Serena Mackenzie took a big lead after the first day shooting an 80. Karina Matabadal shot 88 and Sarah Ramphal followed with 99.

In the boys 14 to 15 age group Antigua's Demar James shot an 82 and has a one stroke lead of Trinidadian David Bhim who shot an 83. Nathan Regalan of Guadeloupe is one stroke further back shooting an 84.

The girl's 14-15 age group Emily Odwin shot a fine 79 to take a 3 stroke lead over defending champion Trinidad & Tobago's Yeji Lee. Michel Anthony of Bahamas follows in 3rd place with an 86.

Chris Richards Jnr of Trinidad & Tobago shot a fine score of 75 to take a 2 stroke lead over Zico Correia his close local rival and Guadeloupe's Theo Jean-Noel who both shot 77.

The girls 13 and under is led by Barbadian Eryn Blakley who shot a score of 91, Kyndal Campbell follows in 2nd place with 94 with Trinidad's Chloe Ajodha shooting 100 to lie in third place.
